Produce Bags – A Beautiful Things designed pattern

Materials required:

1 pack of polyester mesh or a small net curtain
½ metre of lightweight nylon ripstop or a value shower curtain

This should be enough to make approx. 4 – 6 bags depending on size

Cutting guide:

Small bag

Cord channels - 10" x 3" (cut x 2 from ripstop)
Mesh panels – 10" x 8" (cut x 2 from mesh)
Base panel – 10" x 5" (cut x 2 from ripstop)

Large bag

Cord channels - 13" x 3" (cut x 2 from ripstop)
Mesh panels – 13" x 10" (cut x 2 from mesh)
Base panel – 13" x 7" (cut x 2 from ripstop)

Use a ¼" / Edge of presser foot seam allowance throughout unless stated otherwise. Seam allowance is included in the pattern.

Instructions:

- 1) Press over the short ends of both cord channels by ¼ of an inch so that the piece now measures 9 ½ or 12 ½ inches (depending on size cut)
- 2) Topstitch the folded edges down
- 3) Fold each channel piece lengthways, wrong sides together and clip the raw edges to one of the long sides of the mesh
- 4) Place the base panel right sides together along the opposite long side of mesh and clip in place. (repeat with other pieces)
- 5) Stitch both ripstop pieces to the mesh with backtacks at either end. (Repeat on other pieces)
- 6) Press the raw edges up towards the cord channels and down towards the base panels
- 7) Place both sides right sides together and stitch up down both sides and along the bottom. Secure the start and finish of each seam with a backtack
- 8) Draw a 2" square on the bottom two corners from the stitch line
- 9) Cut away the square, nest the seams together to box out the corners
- 10) Sew along both lots of raw edges on the corners
- 11) Turn in the right way
- 12) Thread cord into the left side and all the way around the bag coming out of the same side. Tie in a knot. Repeat with the 2nd cord starting on the opposite side this time
- 13) Admire your finished bag, take some photos of it and upload them to our social media channels.
