



## Scrappy fabric notebook covers

This pattern was designed in-house by Elspeth and is taught as a Beautiful Things class. If you use it to 'make to sell' please be sure to credit it's design.

### Measure your notebook

Top to bottom of notebook		Add ½"	a)
Edge to edge (front to back)		Add ½"	b)
Desired depth of inside slip cover		Add 1"	c)

### Cutting guide

Lightweight interfacing (A x B) + ½" all round (i.e. A+ 1" and B + 1")

Heavyweight interfacing (A x B)

Inside slip pockets **cut x 2** (A x C)

### Instructions

- 1) Iron on strips of scrap fabric to the lightweight interfacing
- 2) Stitch in place using a zig zag stitch (recommended width 5/length 1.5)
- 3) Make sure all areas are covered
- 4) You can add extra strips, lace, string and embroidery stitches at this point if you wish
- 5) Iron on Heavy weight interfacing to the reverse and trim to size of A x B
- 6) Hem 1 long edge of each of the side slips by turning under ¼" and ¼" again and top stitching
- 7) Pin side slips right side up onto wrong side of outer.
- 8) Baste in place at 1/8"
- 9) Test your slipcover for fit and adjust as appropriate
- 10) Zig zag round the outside edge of your cover. (0.5 length and as wide as your machine will allow but no more than 5 some Janome models will go wider than this.)
- 11) Ta-Da slip your cover on your notebook and you are done! If it is too loose, bring in the zig zag slightly.
